About Bengaluru

The capital of Karnataka, Bengaluru (Bangalore) is not only India's IT capital and its own version of Silicon City but also globally recognized as a knowledge hub in many important disciplines. Bengaluru is credited with highly reputed R&D centers in the field of core engineering, information technology, basic and applied sciences, medical sciences, commerce, aerospace etc. With its strong intellectual capital base, Bengaluru provides a stimulating learning environment for faculty and students in institutions of higher learning. How to reach Bengaluru

By AIR

Bengaluru is extremely well-connected by regular flights from Delhi, Mumbai and most other important cities in India and also has international carriers flowing in and out of Kempegowda International Airport, which is located about 40 kilometres from the main city. A taxi from the airport would take about 45 minutes to reach the city.

By TRAIN

Bengaluru has two important railway stations - Bengaluru City Railway Station and Yeswantpur Junction. Both railway stations have regular trains running from Delhi, Mumbai, Pune and other major cities. For travelling within Bengaluru, there is Namma Metro (with limited connectivity), which is an intra-city rail network set up by the Bangalore Metro Rail Corporation.

By BUS

Bangalore is well-connected by a network of buses from cities like Goa, Mumbai, Pune, Coimbatore and Mangalore. The options range from regular buses to air-conditioned, Volvo and sleeper coaches. While some of the buses are run by Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation, there are also a number of private bus operators who run inter-city buses to and from Bangalore.

Places to visit in Bengaluru

Bangalore Palace

A must visit to experience the royal charm of Bangalore with its tudor-inspired architecture. The palace was built in the year 1878 by King Chamaraja Wadiyar and is today open to the public who come to witness the lavish and elegant splendour of one of South India's most enduring dynasties.

M.G. Road

M.G. Road is one of the most popular shopping and entertainment hub of Bangalore. Swarming with people at almost all the time, one must visit the place if in Bangalore. Cauvery Emporium on M.G. Road is the place one must visit to buy antiques, hand crafted wooden statues, various incense sticks, sandalwood crafted items etc.

Lal Bagh

This botanical garden is a haven for all nature lovers. It was commissioned by Hyder Ali in 1760 and completed by Tipu Sultan, with a spread of 240 acres. The garden features rare plants of French, Persian and Afghani origin and has attained status of a Government Botanical Garden.

U.B. City Mall

Located in the Central Business District, this luxury mall is the one-stop destination for all your shopping needs. Made up of four towers, the mall is spread in a mind-boggling area of 13 acres.

Bannerghatta National Park

This National Park was started in a very modest way in the form of "Picnic corner" during the year 1971 in order to provide the picnic facilities to the urban population leaving in the vicinity of Bengaluru. The area of the zoo is a saddle between the Champakadhama hill and Mirza hill in the Bannerghatta Sandal Reserve. The park also houses India's first Butterfly Park.

Tourists can opt for Safari rides through the park.

ISKCON Temple

Apart from a religious temple, ISKCON is a cultural complex accommodating dedicated deities of Sri Sri Radha Krishnachandra, Sri Sri Krishna Balarama, Sri Sri Nitai Gauranga, Sri Srinivasa Govinda and Sri Prahlada Narasimha.

Commercial Street

Shopaholics should visit these spots in Bangalore. Everything from junk jewellery to branded clothes to slippers can be found in the shops that line the street. One can negotiate prices with the street vendors.

Vidhana Soudha

The Vidhana Soudha located in Bengaluru, is the seat of the state legislature of Karnataka. It is an imposing building, constructed in a style sometimes described as Mysore Neo-Dravidian, and incorporates elements of Indo-Saracenic and Dravidian styles.

Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium

Bangalore Association for Science Education (BASE) is devoted to science popularisation and non-formal science education. In addition to administering Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium, BASE has established a Science Centre in the Planetarium. The Science Centre serves as a nucleus for non-formal science education at all levels. The planetarium remains closed on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Bull Temple

This temple is one of the oldest in Bengaluru, and is dedicated to Nandi, the bull who is the vahana of Lord Shiva. The Temple is famous for its large statue of the sacred bull with a height of around 4.6 metres and a length of about 6.1 metres, making it one of the biggest in the world.

Places to visit in Mysore

Mysore Palace

The former residence of the royal family of Mysore, the Mysore Palace is an extremely breath-taking example of the Indo-Saracenic style of architecture. It was built in the year 1912 for the 24th Ruler of the Wodeyar Dynasty and is till date one of the biggest palaces in the country.

Talakadu

Talakadu is on the banks of the river Cauvery. Any visitor to the place will be introduced to the "Curse of Talakadu" by Alamelamma on the Wodeyars of Mysore which turned Talakadu into a desert, caused an ever-present whirlpool in the Malangi river, and made the Wodeyar dynasty unable to beget male heirs since the 17th century.

Somanathapura Temple

The village is named after Somnath, the commander of the Hoysala army who founded this place. The Somnathapura temple is a classic example of the stone carvings in Hoysala architecture.

Brindavan Gardens

Brindavan Gardens of Mysore is undeniably one of the best terrace gardens in the world. It is located about 12km towards the north west of Mysore. Brindavan gardens with its illuminated fountains, botanical park, extensive varieties of plants, is a place for everyone.
